THE PLAYER AGREEMENT:

The PLAYER should maintain a level of performance at school which is sufficient to allow a commitment to participate in all team activities. EKHLA abides by the NO pass NO play policy.

- The PLAYER should make every reasonable effort to attend practice sessions, games, and playoffs.
- The PLAYER should inform the team coach in advance if unable to be in attendance of any team event.
- The PLAYER should always give the coach and staff their utmost respect and attention.
- The PLAYER should always be on time with Athletic gear on (all sports), Kneepads (Volleyball) shin guards, and an INFLATED ball for practices and games. (Soccer)
- The PLAYER should treat every team event as a learning experience, a process of both mistakes and success.
- The PLAYER should be open to instruction and evaluation with a growth mindset. • The PLAYER should make every effort to win within the rules of the game.
- The PLAYER should respect the game officials and the opponents regardless of the result.
- The PLAYER agrees that grievous unsportsmanlike conduct can be grounds for suspension or dismissal.
- The PLAYER should refrain from inappropriate or negative behavior, through actions or words toward any match officials, coaches, players or parents.
- The PLAYER should not use profane language on the training or game field.
- The PLAYER should follow all EKHLA guidelines, policies, and procedures. Failure to comply with the aforementioned Code of Conduct will be grounds for potential PLAYER and/or PARENT disciplinary action. During that time suspension or expulsion could be considered.

THE PARENT AGREEMENT:

- PARENTS must understand that playing time is not guaranteed. Our Goal is to have players play 25% of the time, but remains at the discretion of the coach.
 - ❖ This is assuming we have two 30 min halves for 6-8 grade team and two 25 min halves for 4-6 grade team for Soccer. Game clock can vary.
 - ❖ Basketball it is 6-minute quarters with a 5-minute halftime period. Game clock can vary.
 - ❖ Volleyball it is Best 2 out of 3 sets wins the match (First 2 sets played to 25, win by 2, cap at 30. The third set is played to 15, win by 2, no cap, duration of sets varies.
 - ❖ Court time is also dependent on attendance, abiding by player agreement, and at the discretion of the Coach.
- PARENTS should provide encouragement and create a positive learning environment.
- PARENTS should NOT COACH PLAYERS during games as it may contradict the coach's wishes and numerous voices DO NOT HELP the PLAYER or the team.
- PARENTS should be their player's number one fan and not their coach. The PLAYERS get plenty of coaching from the staff; what PLAYERS need from you are positive support and unconditional love
- PARENTS should cheer and not include direction in their cheering language.
- PARENTS should refrain from inappropriate or negative behavior, through actions or words toward any match officials, players, parents, and coaches.
- PARENTS committing any unlawful act will be subject to suspension or expulsion.
- PARENTS should not use profane language on the training or game field.
- PARENTS should be willing to support the team by their volunteering time, as far as decorating lockers, being linesmen, charging admission, fundraising, etc.
- PARENTS should follow the chain of command when issues arise. The first point of contact is the team coach if needed the next point of contact is the Athletics Director. PARENTS agree to follow the communication protocol regarding issues or concerns.
- **PARENTS agree to follow the 24-hour rule when speaking or communicating with coaches. PARENTS and coaches will wait for 24-hours after a practice or game to discuss team or PLAYER issues. This allows for emotions to subside, so an effective conversation may take place.**
- PARENTS should not talk negatively about any other child to players, parents or coaching staff.
- Unrequested input from parents on coaching decisions will not be welcomed.
- PARENTS will be expected to follow all guidelines, policies, and procedures. Failure to comply with the aforementioned Code of Conduct will be grounds for potential PLAYER and/or PARENT disciplinary action. During that time suspension or expulsion could be considered.
